

Pray for Peace

The world has many conflicts. Peace is God's will for earth and for us. As always, as shown by this set of Bible studies, once we know God's will for a given situation, we are to pour in faith actions to manifest God's will on earth. Think of the Lord's Prayer.

As shown in the "The Big Picture" study, destruction, theft, killing are devil's work and we are to follow Jesus' work and use our faith actions to destroy them. See the other studies to pray effectively doing Jesus' work as Jesus commanded.

[The word "destroy" is used here as it is used in John 10:10, 1 John 3:8, and John 14:12 (KJV)]

God's will of peace for us:

Luke 2:14 Glory to God in the highest, and on earth **peace**, good will **toward men**.

Matthew 5:9 **Blessed are the peacemakers**: for they shall be called the children of God.

Luke 10:5 And into whatsoever house ye enter, first say, **Peace be to this house**.

6 And if the **son of peace** be there, your peace shall rest upon it: if not, it shall turn to you again.

Matthew 5:44 But I say unto you, **Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you**;

This verse above does not mean we help our enemies to do more bad things. As always, we pray for God's will be done on earth. God is zealous to protect his people from harm and loss. See the "Protection" and "Corruption" studies.

45 That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven: for he maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust.

Luke 10:26 He said unto him, What is written in the law? how readest thou?

33 But **a certain Samaritan**, as he journeyed, came where he was: and when he saw him, he had compassion on him,

34 And went to him, and bound up his wounds, pouring in oil and wine, and set him on his own beast, and brought him to an inn, and took care of him.

35 And on the morrow when he departed, he took out two pence, and gave them to the host, and said unto him, Take care of him; and whatsoever thou spendest more, when I come again, I will repay thee.

36 **Which** now of these three, thinkest thou, **was neighbour** unto him that fell among the thieves?

37 And he said, **He that shewed mercy on him**. Then said Jesus unto him, Go, and do thou likewise.

The following portion of the Ten Commandments bears on peace:

Exodus 20:13 Thou shalt not kill. [Not shed innocent blood]

Exodus 20:15 Thou shalt not steal.

16 Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbour.

Possibilities for consideration:

Father God, in the mighty name of Jesus, you expose, show to all, and nullify warmongers [in a location] and their evil deeds.

Father God, in the mighty name of Jesus, you protect the innocent people and their homes and property in [a location], supply their needs, and expose, show to all, and nullify the warmongering and evil deeds there.

Disclaimer:

This is not a tutorial. Only the key Bible verses are listed. You may need to look up the context, the surrounding verses, to get the full message/meaning. The verses here are in the King James translation. A popular Internet Bible with many translations and languages: www.biblegateway.com . You may find translations such as NIV and AMP easier to understand. The Bible verses are in Courier New 12 font, and the clarifications that I inserted into a Bible verse are inside parentheses in italics. If you want more precise translation, go to www.blueletterbible.org, choose the King James Version (KJV), input the book and chapter, and turn on the Strong word option. The returned web page will show Bible verses as well as each word's Strong number, its meaning, and cross references.

Also, using the name of Jesus to receive healing does not mean refusing medical care. You should receive medical care because God wants you healthy. But you should also use Jesus' name to pray the prayer of faith to receive healing from God.

Lastly, these Bible studies do not address other Bible issues. Other issues are well addressed by other Christian sources. These studies only focus on how to receive miracles faster.
